#### From one Minister to Another...

Last Sunday's worship was such a blessing. The sanctuary has taken on its Advent/Christmas glow and each musical offering, whether instrumental or choral, seemed especially meaningful and beautiful. The weather outside was frightful, but our time together was... well, you know!

Right now, the forecast is not great for this Sunday either, but I'm looking forward to the second Sunday of Advent and our focus on PEACE. That's a very important concept in God's word because peace is so vital for our lives. All through Scripture, we keep running across God's promise of peace...

...Which reminds me. It's been over 30 years ago now. I was in my first pastorate. (You're my third. Sorry, we didn't meet until later!) Our fully-loaded church van had made the trip from Roanoke, VA, to Stowe, Vermont. We'd been asked to help with a new church start in that beautiful, but largely unchurched, community.

As our time there ended, I pulled the van into a gas station before making the long trip back home. That's when I had the following conversation.

"You're the Baptists, aren't you—the Baptists from Virginia?" the station attendant asked. "Yes, we are," I answered.

"Been seeing ya' all over town in this van. Whatcha' doing way up here?"

"Well, there's a new church getting started in the community, and we've been here trying to help them. They asked us to come," I explained.

"I see. Well, in that case, I wish you well. I'm a believer. Wish more folks were. As I see it, though, we're heading straight for Armageddon."

"Tell me what you mean," I said, trying to keep the conversation going and the door open for some kind of positive witness. "Well, the Good Book says something about beating swords into plowshares, doesn't it?"

"Yes, it does," I answered. "SURE it does!" he said; "but as I see it, we just keep building more swords. Yet they tell us we can never use them—they'd blow us all up if we did. Doesn't make any sense to me—does it to you?"

"No, it really doesn't," I said. And with that, he was called away to help another customer. Our conversation ended, and the Baptists from down South headed back home. My hunch is that was just fine with him, even though we did seem to connect for a moment.

The Bible talks about that kind of peace, and at least one Vermont gas station attendant knows it! Here's the passage he referenced from Isaiah 2: <sup>4</sup> He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples. They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore. <sup>5</sup> Come, descendants of Jacob, let us walk in the light of the LORD.

But there's another kind of peace that Isaiah describes, and even though we didn't get to talk about it, I hope the attendant knew about this peace also: "You will keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You" (Isaiah 26:3).

'Nations continue to take up swords against nations.' This is not what our Lord wants; but for now, there's still a lot of conflict in our world." Desire peace, pray for peace, and work toward peace. Our Savior came, after all, to bring "peace on earth, goodwill to men!"

In the meantime, though, never lose sight of the fact that in Christ Jesus, the peace He brings to our hearts is more powerful than all the conflicts that exist out in the world. Join us Sunday as we focus on the Prince of Peace!

And remember that we're still a people "on mission" for Christ. Bring an offering to support the ministry of First Baptist Church. And bring another offering to support the work of our missionaries who serve in places where we'll never go.

Now, go find those offering envelopes and make sure your gifts to our Lord and His work in this world are generous. There's no better way for us to demonstrate that we've not lost sight of what Christmas is all about!
