

From One Minister to Another...

The quote from Mahatma Gandhi, "I like your Christ; I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ," can be a bit unsettling, can't it? Determining if such a statement is "fair" really depends on which Christians one encounters. We all know some people who seem to embody Christ's teachings faithfully and beautifully, while others might make us question if they even understand Jesus at all.

Over time, I've come to realize that I can't control how others perceive Christians as a whole. What I can control is my own actions and how they reflect my faith.

This responsibility extends to anyone who identifies as a follower of Christ.

It's crucial not to dismiss Gandhi's comment too quickly, as many people who aren't Christians might share his viewpoint, whether they voice it or not. People of faith are often held to higher standards, both by others and by God, and our hypocritical behavior discourages others from following Jesus. You must be mindful of how your actions represent Christ in your everyday interactions.

Christians often face this criticism, and while some of it may be unfair, it's a reality for many who are exploring faith or trying to return to the church after past disappointments.

Let's be honest: we will all inevitably fall short of others' expectations at times. Only Jesus fully meets those expectations. We remain imperfect reflections of Him.

Just as Jesus atoned for our sin because our "righteousness is as filthy rags," (Isaiah 64:6) we need to present the true essence of Jesus to those seeking to understand our faith. If someone says they'd like to believe in Christ but hasn't seen a Christian who reflects Him, let's not take offense or argue. Instead, we should offer them Christ Himself, and through our humble, imperfect attempts, introduce them to the Good News so they can discover the real Jesus for themselves.

Ultimately, while Christians are sometimes obstacles to faith, the authentic Jesus is compelling and difficult to resist.

VOTING INFORMATION FOR THIS SUNDAY'S CONFERENCE

FBC MEMBERS,

Several of you have reached out in various ways to ask exactly what the procedure will be for voting in our Church Conference on August 25, in order to ensure it is done in a fair and secure manner. According to our bylaws, there are two different ways to vote:

Absentee Ballots

"In case of a written ballot, Members may vote by absentee ballot if they cannot attend because of physical incapacity or absence from the city. Absentee voting is possible only in advance of the meeting at which voting by written ballot is scheduled." (Article IV; Section 5). A person who meets these requirements may at this time request a ballot from the office, or come by the office to vote if they will not be here on August 25.

Please note the member who will be voting must request the ballot, and someone may not request or pick up a ballot on behalf of another person. Sharon will make a note of those who have requested the ballot. When a ballot is returned, she will note the name on the return address of the envelope, and place the ballot inside a locked box that will not be opened until the Business Conference. If there is no return address on the exterior envelope, the ballot will not be counted. The only way to ensure a person does not vote twice is to log who has already voted. If a person is concerned with the privacy of their vote, they may put their marked ballot inside a blank, sealed envelope, and then put that sealed envelope in a second, exterior envelope that contains their name and the church address so that their ballot may be secret. That way Sharon can log who returned the ballot without seeing a vote. Please also note that all absentee ballots will be on a blue sheet of paper, so they will be distinct from in-person ballots.

Business Conference

For those who will be present to vote on August 25, during the conference, if you regularly attend worship and/or Sunday School, there will be a sealed envelope with your name on the outside and your ballot inside. We will distribute these envelopes during the Conference. If someone does not receive an envelope, there will be a table where that person can go and request their ballot from Bob Lingle, Linda Chadbourne, and Chris Liles, who will verify their membership status, and that they did not already cast an absentee ballot. Then they will receive their ballot in order to vote. At the conclusion of the voting period, marked ballots will be placed in the same locked ballot box as the absentee ballots.

Vote Counting

At the conclusion of discussion and our voting period, our counting team made up of Ann Campbell (in her official capacity as Recording Secretary), and three of our Deacons, Becky Campbell, Al Whitney, and Pat Vickery, will carry the ballot box into the Choir Suite. There they will unlock the box, count, record, and verify the votes. Once they agree on the official tally, the results will be announced to the congregation, and the ballots will be kept on file in the church fire safe until August 25, 2025, so that anyone who has any doubts about the reported total may review them for themselves.
