From One Minister to Another...

September is birth month at our house, with Bas being the only member of my family not celebrating a birthday this month. My birthday was last week. I'm from Virginia, and, as Jerry Clower was fond of saying when he told his story, "it was there that I first saw the light of day" 44 years ago at Johnston Memorial Hospital in a small town called Abingdon.

On September 4, Diana Ross's "Upside Down" was the number one song on the radio, "Ordinary People" was the most popular movie, and the cover story of *Life* magazine was about "the broiling summer of '80."

As I so often do, I thought last week about my parents and how they raised me, sacrifices they made for me, and values they instilled in me. I thought about how they made a point to raise me in church, a decision that made an indelible mark on my life.

I thought about my 20 years of marriage to Sacha and how blessed I am to be her husband. I thought about the joys of fatherhood and how blessed I am to call Jude and Bas my children.

I recalled teachers, friends, and my pastors growing up. I thought about the day I came forward to make my public profession of faith. I remembered my baptism. I thought about God calling me into ministry when I was a high school senior on a spring break student retreat at Eagle Eyrie in Lynchburg, Virginia. I thought about being simultaneously scared and at peace with my acceptance of that call. (I would come to learn that this is a familiar feeling for people called to ministry – and that it lasts a lifetime!)

I've been in vocational ministry for more than twenty years and I thought about the people I've had the privilege of working with – and those whom I have seen God work through.

The, ahem, more experience I have celebrating birthdays, the more I come to see that birthdays are a wonderful opportunity to celebrate God's gift of life. Birthdays are for more than looking back. They're for looking forward, too, to renewed life, renewed joy, and a renewed commitment to make the most of this wondrous gift. Every birthday is a chance to commit oneself to making changes in life, to get rid of unhealthy habits and to develop new positive ones.

For me, it was an opportunity to thank God for my blessings. Birthdays are a chance to say that no matter what happened yesterday, last week, last month, last year—whatever it brought into our lives—we get a new chance, another opportunity to celebrate God's gift of life. And to commit ourselves to being the people God has created and called us to be.

Thankfully, we need not wait for our birthdays to be thankful. Every day provides us an opportunity to share appreciation and to receive with gratitude God's gift of life.

I close with this beautiful daily prayer by Richard of Chichester, the Thirteenth-Century saint, which was popularized by lyricist Stephen Schwartz in the musical "Godspell."
